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From the Front Platform—Thoughts on Our Museum

Doors Open Minneapolis Recap. On May 17-18 we participated in Doors Open Minneapolis for the third straight year, one of about 100 venues opening up their behind-the-scenes facilities to the public. It's a big operation, requiring an extra 10am-12:30pm streetcar shift both days, a shop cleanup beforehand and four shifts of 3-4 carbarn guides each. All told 25 volunteers filled 33 scheduled shifts. Working multiple shifts were Keith Anderson, Bill Arends, Rose Arends, Pat Cosgrove, Aaron Isaacs, Augie Lassig and Dennis Stephens. I'm pleased to say the event came off smoothly.



What did we get for all that work? Lots of visitors. They checked in with the pair of volunteers from Doors Open operator *Rethos* who were stationed at the

Linden Hills station. They counted 406 who toured the carbarn Saturday, and 599 on Sunday, a total of 1005. That's 100 more than either of the previous years.

There was no charge for the tours. Visitors had the option of walking up to the carbarn, but most chose to buy a streetcar ride and get off at the barn. The trip sheets show a total of 1004 riders, 320 on Saturday and 684 on Sunday. Fare revenue for the weekend was up 19 percent from 2024. It was also a good weekend for merchandise sales, \$1017 up 57 percent from 2024. Thanks to **Bill Arends** for the revenue stats...

My thanks to all who participated. I heard multiple compliments on our professionalism, the cleanliness of the shop and lots of thanks for preserving streetcar history.

Depot Canopy Roof—Not Quite Yet. The roof board installation has turned out to be more complicated than we expected, but it's finally underway. Work was delayed by rain and the long Memorial Day weekend. All the steel rafters have to be drilled to receive a narrow board screwed on top of them. The actual roof boards that fill the voids between the rafters come next. Once that's done, the roofing contractor will install the cedar shakes that replicate the historic roof.

Dick Stoner's Models and Photos. MSM member **Dick Stoner**, who passed away last year, was a terrific O-scale model builder. This year I helped his wife Barbara dispose of his collection of rail photos and paper ephemera. It was important that these items find a good home, so packages were sent to the Missabe Railroad Historical Society, Soo Line Historical Society, Chicago & North Western Historical Society, Burlington Route Historical Society, Great Northern Historical Society, Northern Pacific Historical Society and the Shore Line Interurban Historical Society. We received 58 of Dick's Minnesota streetcar photos. In addition, we purchased five of his O-scale trolley and interurban models:

- Mesaba Railway #10 in the original dark green color scheme
- Mesaba Railway combine #12 in the green scheme
- Mesaba Railway #13 in the later maroon color scheme.
- Minneapolis Anoka & Cuyuna Range #1 and #3 in the red, white and blue World War II scheme.

The Mesaba models are on display in the Excelsior Streetcar Line's carbarn. The MA&CR cars are in the Russell Olson Library in the George K. Isaacs carbarn at Como-Harriet.

From the CHSL Shop

The first prototype bronze castings for the TCRT 1239 truck rebuilding project came from Windy Hill Foundry in August 2023. **Rob Mangels** milled the mating surfaces in his shop in January 2024. Lathe work at CHSL began with process and tooling development in March 2024. It's taken just over two years to complete 8 bearing sets (16 half shells).

The motor axle support bearing sets are shown on the left. The photo on the right shows the last operation, milling oil distribution grooves to feed the flange (thrust) face.
